Owls - The PE cupboard, no unsafe places, playground when teachers don't spread out, old ICT suite, environmental area (Woodlands) because someone could climb over the fence.

Firecrests - Woodlands because of wild animals, nowhere is unsafe, back of the field because of stinging nettles, pirate island.

Finches - Everywhere is safe unless you are alone with a visitor with a red lanyard.

Sparrows - Climbing wall - slippery and wobbly, wood sticking up on playground, branches on field

Swifts - Woodlands - glass, iPads, field if you can't be seen by an adult

Robins - outside if you trip over, woodlands

Wrens - The kitchen - fire and hot, the pond but you have to stay with adults, the cleaning cupboard

(Environmental area is safe - will reassure the children, children aren't allowed in the PE cupboard, LSA meeting to discuss playtimes and support, added back of field, pirate island, playground to caretaker log to address, children aren't allowed on climbing wall when slippery, children aren't allowed in the kitchen or cleaning cupboard)
