



Owls

Red - Visitor who can't go round the school without a member of school staff

Blue - Teacher, LSA or Office, Mr P who can be alone with Children

Green - DBS - visitors like music teachers than can be in school on their own.

Yellow - Mrs Dennis, Miss Jones, Miss Sims and Mrs Robinson - Safeguarding leads

Finches

RED - visitor - no child is allowed to be alone with these visitors.

BLUE - Teaching and LSA who are allowed to be with children.

GREEN - non school staff who are hosting a club etc, but safe to be with children.

YELLOW - part of the senior leadership team

What do the four different coloured lanyards mean? Red / Blue / Green / Yellow

Sparrows

Yellow - deputy and head

Blue - staff or teacher

Red - need someone to be with you

Green - Teaching assistant going in different classrooms

Swifts

Red- A visitor who needs an adult with them.

Blue- A member of St Pauls school staff.

Green- A visitor who can be on their own

Yellow- One of the most trusted adults, like Mrs Dennis, the one who's in charge. the yellows are on the posters

Firecrests

Red: Visitor, they are not allowed to be with children on their own without a person with a blue, green or yellow lanyard.

Blue: Safe to be with children alone, St Paul's teachers and LSA's

Green: DBS checked, Governors

Yellow: Safeguarding team, safe to be around children alone
